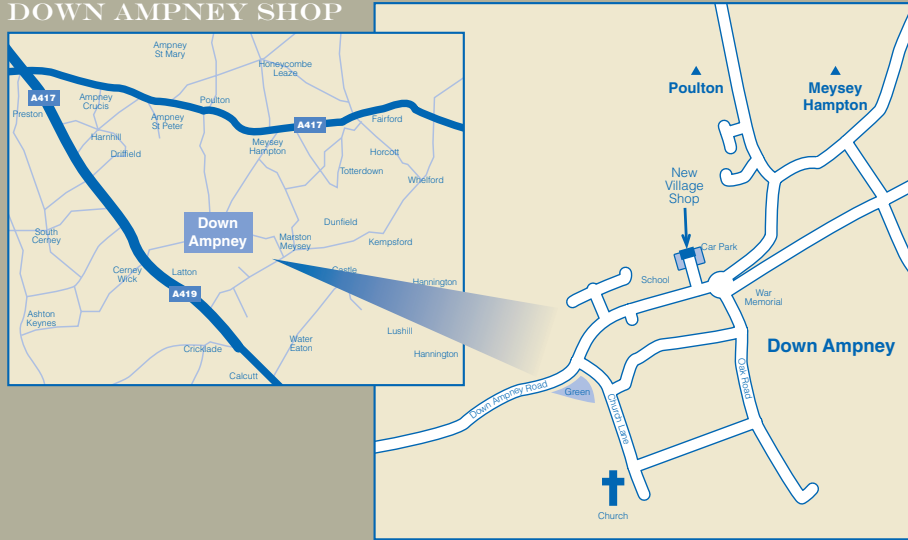

DOWN AMPNEY VILLAGE SHOP



DOWN AMPNEY is a small village on the borders of Gloucestershire and Wiltshire within the triangle bounded by Cirencester, Cricklade and Fairford, and is within the Cotswold Water Park. We are very proud of our Village Hub, developed over the years to include a new village hall, tennis courts, children's play area and multi-use games area and now our new purpose-built village shop.

A museum in All Saints Church, Down Ampney, celebrates the life of Ralph Vaughan Williams who was born here. There is also a memorial to those who fought at Arnhem, their base being the airfield on the outskirts of the village.

Down Ampney welcomes visitors who can visit our Village Hub and explore and enjoy the many rural walks in our area.

Our community shop is run entirely by volunteers drawn from our residents and it is because of their efforts that we successfully gained funding to move from a portacabin, that was used for over twelve years, into our splendid new premises in July 2010. We are justly proud that it is the oldest social enterprise in Gloucestershire and the new shop demonstrates the dedication and efforts of our team over the years in developing this essential amenity. In addition to the village shop, the premises are occupied by our post office, and a café serving light snacks and drinks.



The Hub is at the heart of our village with the shop providing for daily needs and essentials at competitive prices, for residents within our own community as well as neighbouring communities. The stock carried surprises many first time visitors and includes a range of bread baked on the premises, cakes and pastries as well as branded (Down Ampney) products such as biscuits, preserves and pickles, as well as an expanding variety of locally produced food.

Our customers are recognised as being our greatest asset for a sustainable future. We can therefore say with sincerity that the facility is 'Run by the Community for the Community'.
